MDHA Legislative Update

Mobile Dentistry Legislation

House Bill 4865 introduced by State Representative Peter MacGregor was signed into law by Governor Rick Snyder and is now known as Public Act 100 of 2014. The new law requires mobile dental facilities to establish relationships with local area dentists to ensure patients are referred for proper follow-up dental procedures and improved treatment.

"Good dental health contributes to good overall health. Children and seniors are among our most vulnerable residents and they are also the most common customers of mobile dental facilities," Mr. Snyder said in a statement. "Raising the quality of care delivered by these facilities will help ensure all Michiganders receive the services needed to live healthy lives."

Mobile dental facilities tend to travel to schools, head-start centers and nursing homes on a regular basis but do not always return to the same location, the governor's office noted. The bill would also require owners of mobile dental facilities to apply for a permit through the Department of Community Health, and it defined appropriate equipment and supplies for such facilities.

Public Act 161 program practitioners will now be regulated under this law as mobile dental facilities. Those with current Memorandums of Agreement will continue to use their existing documentation. Those who do not have MOA's will be required to complete them to continue offering services under PA 161.

MDHA weighed in regularly throughout the legislative process to garner many improvements to the legislation for PA 161 program participants.

Healthy Kids Dental

Governor Snyder's fiscal year 2015 budget proposals includes an additional \$15.6 million be added to Michigan's Healthy Kids Dental program in order to expand it to Macomb and Kalamazoo counties beginning in October of 2014. If successful, this will leave only Kent and Wayne County children without this important coverage. The MDHA is supportive of this funding and has communicated with legislators about the funding.

ADHA Supports Creation of Dental Hygiene Therapists in Maine

The American Dental Hygienists' Association (ADHA) applauds the creation of a dental hygiene therapist (DHT) in Maine. Maine Governor Paul LePage signed the bill into law on April 28, 2014. This new member of the oral health team will be a registered dental hygienist who has additional education and experience.

The DHT will perform duties that include: assessment, cavity preparations and restorations, simple extractions, placement of crowns and space maintainers, referrals, administration of local and nitrous oxide anesthesia, preventive services and trauma management as well as administration of radiographs, and the provision, dispensing and administration of medications within the scope of the written practice agreement.

ADHA strives to expand access to oral health care for all Americans. Its policies support the development of a midlevel oral health practitioner defined as a licensed dental hygienist who has graduated from an accredited dental hygiene program and who provides primary oral health care directly to patients to promote and restore oral health through assessment, diagnosis, treatment, evaluation and referral services. This provider must meet the educational requirements to provide services within an expanded scope of care and practice under regulations set forth by the appropriate licensing agency.

As in other parts of the U.S., lack of access to dental care is a serious problem in Maine. While the creation of DHTs to improve the oral and overall health of Maine residents is a positive step, the legislation as written would be improved with the removal of restrictions that prevent the new provider from working in locations such as nursing homes, schools, physicians' offices and hospitals as well as dental offices without the direct supervision of a dentist. ADHA policy recognizes that dental hygienists who are graduates of an accredited program are competent to provide dental hygiene services without supervision. Oral health care providers in Maine and Alaska — as well

as more than 50 countries worldwide — are already proving that underserved populations can be served safely and effectively under off-site or general supervision by collaborating dentists.

A recent report by the National Governors Association encourages states who are facing increasing demand for oral health to examine the role that dental hygienists can play in increasing access to care by allowing them to practice to the full extent of their education and training. Similarly, the Federal Trade Commission also weighed in late in 2013; in a written statement to the Commission on Dental Accreditation, the FTC stated that "[t]he ability of dental therapists to work without a dentist on the premises is critical to their ability to increase the availability of dental care in areas where dentists are scarce or unavailable."

BONNIE NOTHOFF MEMORIAL FUNDRAISER FOR MDH-PAC



Bonnie Nothoff was President of the Michigan Dental Hygienists' Association in 1998-99. She became MDHA's Governmental Affairs Liaison in 2001, Director of Governmental Affairs in 2003 and was our Lobbyist from 2008 until her death in July, 2013. She worked tirelessly to organize, educate and inspire dental hygienists in Michigan to take an active role in pursuing many legislative initiatives. She helped us pass legislation that has greatly impacted the scope of practice of dental hygienists in Michigan and resulted in improved dental care for the public.

The legislation she helped MDHA pass was monumental: administration of local anesthetic and nitrous oxide analgesia by the dental hygienist with direct supervision by the dentist, our education in law not rule, impressions for mouth guards, bite splints, orthodontic appliances and bleaching trays, mandated one hour of pain management per license renewal period and the expansion of PA 58 to PA 161. This was her proudest achievement for it allowed expanded functions to underserved populations in specific sites such as schools, nursing homes and community health programs. The last legislation she was involved with was "second pair of hands" which allowed a dental hygienist to receive assistance by another individual.

Bonnie taught us the legislative process and encouraged each hygienist to contact his or her state senator and state representative and establish a working relationship with them. She would be the first to say our work is not done. This is an election year and the Michigan Dental Hygienists' Political Action Committee needs your help.

The MDH-PAC is establishing an annual fundraiser in memory of Bonnie and all she did for dental hygienists in Michigan. The PAC uses its funds to support state senators and state representatives that support our legislative goals.

Major risk factors are tobacco and heavy alcohol use, but this disease can strike anyone. If detected in its earliest stages, oral cancer is easily treated. One hundred percent (100%) of the proceeds from the Oral, Head and Neck Cancer Walk are contributed to the UDM Oral Biopsy fund. The UDM Oral Biopsy Fund provides financial support for patients who cannot afford care, to receive a free oral biopsy.
