COURSE DESCRIPTIONS:

“Saving and Rejuvenating Enamel.”
“MI” (Minimal Intervention) dentistry is the modern
“medical” approach to the management of decay. Two
key elements of the MI philosophy of Identifying and
Preventing will be presented. This course provides an
“in depth” discussion on enamel maturation, the caries
balance theory and highlights the importance of saliva.

Saliva is liquid gold to the oral cavity! We have come to
recognize that the mouth is a mirror of the body, and it
is critical to our overall health and well-being. This
course will describe the relationship of systemic
diseases and the oral environment and discuss risk
assessment through hands-on saliva testing. Preventive
management strategies and treatment protocols will be
discussed for reversing demineralization, high-risk caries
patients and xerostomic patients to include fluoride
varnish therapy and the incorporation of calcium and
phosphate homecare products.

In addition, this course will discuss the different
working mechanisms of glass ionomer as a surface
protectant/sealant, usage of topical fluoride, ACP and
CPP-ACP and how these innovative materials can
influence your patient's oral health.

“Periodontal Pearls of Wisdom.”
Periodontal disease myth versus fact will
discuss goals of surgery and what really happens
during open debridement. The psychology of the
periodontally involved patient, recall rationale and
compliance. Including information regarding
mechanical debridement, subgingival anatomy, local
contributing factors that matter, and realistic/practical
home care routines.
