Sheree received her Bachelor of Science in Dental Hygiene degree from the University of Michigan (U of M) in 1980 and her Master of Science in Health Care Administration from Central Michigan University (CMU) in 1991. After practicing dental hygiene full-time in the periodontal specialty practice setting for over 10 years, she became the Administrator of the Mott's Children's Health Center Dental Department. She later pursued an academic career, which began at U of M as an adjunct instructor. Over her near 40 year career, she has had the opportunity to hold various roles including faculty member, dental hygiene program director, associate dean of dental programs in the private college, community college and university settings. She has taught extensively both in the classroom and clinical settings.

Course Objectives:

- Become familiar with the differences between the current and newly developed classification system of periodontal diseases;
- Explain various clinical decisions regarding the selection of advanced periodontal instrumentation for the natural and implant dentition;
- Explain the rationale and appropriate usage of locally delivered chemotherapeutic agents currently available;
- Recognize the limitations of calculus removal and the expectations of clinical proficiency.

Prior to orthodontics, Dr. Fry graduated from University of Nevada-Las Vegas School of Dental Medicine in 2011 and practiced General Dentistry for 4 years after completing a 1 year Advanced Education in General Dentistry residency at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base in Dayton, OH. She served as a Captain over 5 years in the USAF and Michigan Air National Guard combined. She currently practices in Petoskey, Michigan at Brazones Orthodontics and Associates.

The Pediatric Airway and Our Role in Dentistry: What We Can and Can't Do

Course Objectives:

Sleep disordered breathing in children is concerning as it has adverse effects on brain and physical development, behavior, and growth of facial structures. This course will review the airway anatomy in the pediatric patient, discuss normal airway measurements with CBCT imaging to determine at risk patients. It will address normal and abnormal growth of the dentofacial structures to explain how to identify patients with possible airway issues. The course will examine how diagnosis is made for pediatric patients and analyze the effects maxillary expansion and other dental treatment modalities on the airway including indications/contraindications and limitations of these interventions.

Diagnosing Active Arthritis of the TMJ's from a Panoramic Film: What Does the Extra Dimension in a CBCT offer?

Course Objectives:

As 3-D imaging becomes more available in dental offices new information is available regarding the health of the TMJs. This course will compare panoramic films to CBCT imaging to observe use and limitations of a panoramic image as a screening tool for degeneration of the condyles. It will cover different levels of arthritis and co-existing pathologies/disorders in both the pediatric and adult populations. The course will advise on current modalities of treatment of active arthritis in the TMJ. Last, the discussion will offer ideas on patient positioning during radiographs to get ideal diagnostic information of the TMJs specifically.
